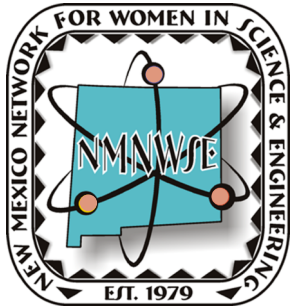

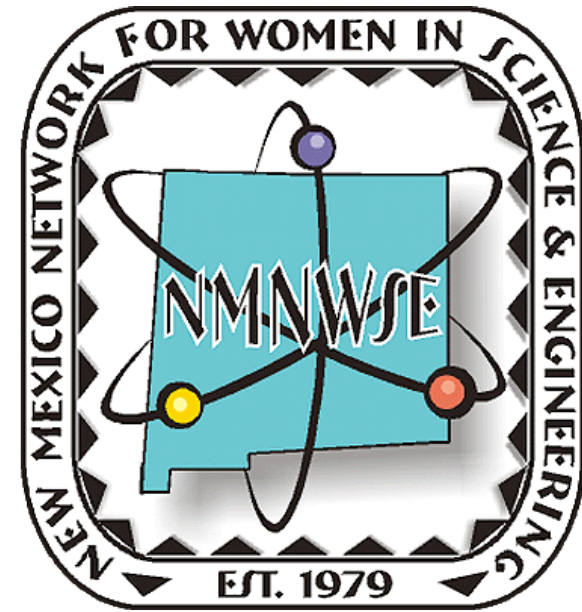

The meeting will take place in the historic Eklund Hotel, a landmark for travelers of the southwest since the 1890s. Clayton is near the Texas border in northeastern NM, in the vicinity of Mt. Capulin, Clayton Lake State Park (with dinosaur tracks), and the Kiowa National Grasslands, in addition to still-visible Santa Fe Trail tracks. It's an interesting area to explore.

The meeting will begin with a Friday evening reception. Saturday morning is the annual business meeting of the Network, followed by technical talks by members and students in the afternoon. Saturday ends with presentation of the inaugural IMPACT! Award and an after-dinner program highlighting the local area. Members are invited to stay through Sunday for the first meeting of the new state board, elected Saturday.
