2008 TECHNICAL SYMPOSIUM & ANNUAL MEETING — REGISTER NOW! —

The 2008 Technical Symposium and Annual Meeting of the New Mexico Network for Women in Science and Engineering (**AM08**) will be held **October 24–26** at the Sierra Grande Lodge and Spa in Truth or Consequences, NM, known for its soothing hot springs, scenic terrain, and mild climate. Nearby, Spaceport America capitalizes on the region's place in the history of rocketry and the aerospace industry.

The meeting will commence with a reception Friday evening. Saturday begins with the annual business meeting, followed by free time to explore the area and have lunch. The afternoon technical sessions this year will be divided into two parts: We begin with the technical talks, which are 30 minutes including questions. In the early evening, poster presentations will be available for viewing and discussion during a wine and cheese reception at the Lodge. We highly encourage the submission of posters. Abstracts are to be submitted to the NMNWSE Board by **Oct. 3, 2008**. The conference dinner on Saturday evening features presentation of the Network's IMPACT! Award and keynote speaker Gwynne Shotwell of SpaceX, a space exploration technologies firm.

The network has arranged for reduced rates at the conference hotel, but rooms must be reserved by **Sep. 15, 2008**. We encourage you to reserve your hotel room and register for the meeting as soon as possible.

2008 IMPACT AWARD DEADLINE EXTENDED

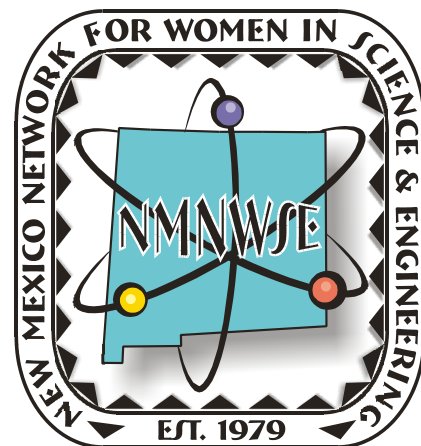

PERSONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Yolanda King was selected as this year's recipient of the 2008 Women in Aerospace (WIA) International Achievement Award. The prestigious award is given for "*outstanding contributions to aerospace in the international arena on a single project over several years, or during a career, a commitment to professional growth, and service as a role model or mentor that shows dedication to the advancement of women in aerospace.*" The award cites Yolanda's distinctive accomplishments in international aerospace collaboration and her role as Chair of the NATO Sensor and Electronics Technology (SET) Panel, and recognizes her for serving as a role model, reflecting great credit upon herself, her state, and the international community. The award will be presented at the WIA Awards Reception and Dinner, on Tuesday, October 14, 2008, at the National Press Club in Washington, DC. Claudia Barreto was promoted to Associate Professor of Biology in the Science Department at the University of New Mexico Valencia Campus. Claudia was able to go up for tenure early (after only 3 years) because she was previously a tenured professor at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee.

PERSONAL HIGHLIGHTS, cont'd

Dana Roberson presented Agile CMMI (Capability Maturity Model Integrated) to the New Mexico .NET User's Group on Thursday, Aug. 7, 2008. 'While most proponents of Agile and CMMI feel the two are incompatible, they actually compliment each other. Neither is the "best" or "worst" model. A careful analysis of CMMI reveals its agility.' She also taught an Introduction to CMMI Class week of Aug. 20, 2008.

Elizabeth M. Kallman of Ball Aerospace in Albuquerque presented *Heat Transfer Simulations of Laser-Irradiated Semi-Transparent Materials Using ANSYS TAS* (with Joel S. Davis of BATC and David Rosato of ANSYS) on 27 Aug. 2008 at the 2008 Intl. ANSYS Conference. The talk was well-received; immediately after the presentation she was invited to present the work again at an upcoming meeting in Dayton OH.

Jennifer E. Nisengard had a paper published in the Spring 2008 Journal of Field Archaeology entitled *Seismic Refraction at Ancestral Puebloan Sites on the Pajarito Plateau, New Mexico*. She presented a paper at the 73rd Annual Society for American Archaeology Meetings in Vancouver, BC entitled *Cultural resources and recreational trails use at Los Alamos National Laboratory, Los Alamos, New Mexico, education and mitigation*.
