


Background

- Child care has been an issue at the Laboratory since the 1950's.
 Numerous initiatives have been started and stopped.
- Established a Child Care Initiative Committee in September 2005.
 - The dependant care shortfall is 90-100 spots based on current workforce needs.
 - There is no single solution to address all needs.
 - We must rebuild trust with both the workforce and the community.
 - We must follow cost-allowability rules.

Quick Wins

- Nursing Rooms at two locations: HSR-2 Occupational Medicine (TA-3-1411) and Community Affairs (TA-0-762)/ Work breaks
- Community Dependant Care Centralized Training UNM-LA training for dependent care providers, staff, and parents.
- Dependant Care Administrator in-house
- Pilot "Guarantee" Program
- Expansion into Northern New Mexico





Status of Child Care Efforts

- Longer Term Solutions Create significant additional capability within the community. Options include:
 - Add distributed new facilities in the community
 - Lease building(s) within the community
 - Build new facility
 - Expand "guarantee" program
- Next steps
 - Preliminary data in hand project definition underway
 - Continue to meet "cost allowability" requirements
 - Integrate solutions with LANS
